Year 3 Weeks 3 and 4 Creating a Tonal Value Scale Photography



'Creating a Tonal Value Scale'

Using items from around your home, arrange them from lightest to darkest.

Try to find things in different shapes and sizes.

Think about your background you will place them on how does this affect your picture?

Take a photo using your camera using your computer or a device.

Think about the positioning of your objects inside your camera frame to make it central.

Think about lighting around your picture and how this affects your design.

Have a go at taking the same photo in a different space. How does the lighting impact your photo?

Challenge: Using a grey led pencil have a go at sketching your photo. Think about the size of each item and how it compares to other objects. Shade in your design building up depth of colour.

Early finishers: Head into the outdoors and create a tonal value scale from dark to light by gathering natural items.

*Remember to have your camera set to black and white or once you've taken your photo use your edit button to add a black and white filter.

Challenge: Using a grey led pencil have a go at sketching your photo. Think about the size of each item and how it compares to other objects. Shade in your design building up depth of colour. Add the finer details to your natural objects like the vines in a leaf.

Remember you have 2 weeks to complete this project so take your time and try your best.
